## 2006 Wins

### Car-Free Parks

● **More car-free hours** as part of fractional closures of portions of the loop drives in both Central and Prospect Parks. These fractional closures have been made permanent.

### Better Biking

- **City committed** to installing 200 new miles of bike lanes over the next three years and 40 new miles of greenways over the next four. **City released** its comprehensive study of cycling crashes and fatalities.
- **NYC DOT** added more staff to its planning and cycling programs.

### Safe Streets

- **New pedestrian plaza** in Stuyvesant Town on Manhattan's East side.
- **Expansion of life-saving** red light enforcement camera program.
- **Released "Necessity or Choice,"** a study demonstrating the vast majority of motorists driving to midtown Manhattan have better ways to get there.
- **Exposed parking permit** abuse by City employees.
- **Held two car-free days** on the Grand Concourse in the Bronx
